



ENGLISH LITERATURE (LTP) – YEAR 10



Term	Learning content/skills
Autumn 1 7 weeks	<p><u>Weeks 1-7: Anthology of Power and Conflict Poetry (Literature Paper 2)</u></p> <p>Students will be introduced to an initial 6 poems out of the AQA Anthology to explore how power and conflict have been represented over the years. Themes of belief, loss and hope across different cultures and significant events are compared and analysed. Skills will focus on poetic techniques, use of language, form and structure. Students are guided to write analytical essay responses to the comparison of two poems in preparation for their year 11 Literature exam.</p>
Autumn 2 7 weeks	<p><u>Week 1-2: Knowledge Retrieval of An Inspector Calls (Literature Paper 2)</u></p> <p>After reading the complete play in year 9, students will retrieve knowledge on characters, context, themes and important quotes to support their understanding. This two-week scheme is a successful project which narrows the gap of knowledge in between single large text studies. Students will regain and confirm confidence by recalling required knowledge and skill. There will be focus on how to analyse meaningful quotes and developing academic writing.</p> <p><u>Weeks 3-7: Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol (Literature Paper 1)</u></p> <p>Following preparation in year 9 with a scheme on 19th Century Literature, students are introduced to Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol. Students will become familiar with the context, themes, plot and characters of the novella with guidance on how to annotate for success and a respond with academic writing.</p>



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Spring 1 6 weeks	<p><u>Week 1: Knowledge Retrieval of Anthology of Power and Conflict Poetry (Literature Paper 2)</u></p> <p>Students will complete their second scheme of Knowledge Retrieval with an emphasis on the poems they analysed in Autumn Term 1. Key quotes and context will be recalled as well as modelled writing to develop comparative essay responses. This reinforces their learning from the previous term, thus easing the transition into year 11 exam skills.</p> <p><u>Weeks 2-3: Anthology of Power and Conflict Poetry (Literature Paper 2)</u></p> <p>The initial two weeks of this term will cement skills students require to study and analyse 3 further poems from the AQA Anthology of Power and Conflict Poetry. Students are encouraged to continue deciphering the effects of language, form and structure. Students will gain further insight and confidence into which poems are most suitable for comparing.</p> <p><u>Weeks 4-6: William Shakespeare's Macbeth (Literature Paper 1)</u></p> <p>Students will begin their AQA Literature Shakespearian play: Macbeth. These 3 weeks are designed for students to become familiar with context, themes, plot and characters. Teachers will map out effective reading strategies to the play so all can access and be able to translate the language for comprehension.</p>
Spring 2 6 weeks	<p><u>Weeks 1-3: William Shakespeare's Macbeth (Literature Paper 1)</u></p> <p>Students will continue to read the play and gain a wide understanding to the whole text and allegory. With this, lessons will then demonstrate how to extract and annotate essential content for the GCSE essay exam style questions.</p>



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	<p><u>Weeks 4-6: Knowledge Retrieval of Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol (Literature Paper 1)</u></p> <p>This is the third cycle of knowledge retrieval with the attention on the 19th Century novella: A Christmas Carol. Students revisit and begin to challenge pre-existing knowledge on plot, character, themes and context. At this stage, students are taught to be able to recall a cluster of thematic and quote examples from across the whole text to support GCSE exam style questions.</p>
<p>Summer 1</p> <p>5 weeks</p>	<p><u>Weeks 1-5: Knowledge Retrieval and PPE Literature Paper 1 Preparation</u></p> <p>With a direct focus on A Christmas Carol and Macbeth, teachers individually plan a mixture of retrieval and exam preparation style lessons for the upcoming PPE. Students will be explicitly taught the layout and expectations of PPE Literature Paper 1 as well as revision techniques.</p>
<p>Summer 2</p> <p>8 weeks</p>	<p><u>Weeks 1-4: Prep for PPE Literature Paper 1</u></p> <p>This is a continuation of individualised and target grade planning to support students in their PPE season.</p> <p><u>Weeks 5-8: Knowledge Retrieval of J.B Priestley's An Inspector Calls (Literature Paper 2)</u></p> <p>The final study of English Literature is An Inspector Calls retrieval. The entire play is revisited in preparation for the students' first term in year 11 where they will prepare for the PPE Literature Paper 1.</p>
